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Rotary District 3271

Rotary District 3271, led by District Governor Shahzad Sabir, brings together Rotary Clubs united by a shared commitment to Rotary International's vision of building a better world through service. Spanning a diverse network of clubs and thousands of dedicated Rotarians, the district plays a vital role in translating Rotary's global mission into action on the ground, particularly through Global Grant projects that bring international partnerships and significant resources to bear on local needs.

Under the leadership of District Governor Shahzad Sabir and the District Grants Committee, District 3271 coordinates and supports clubs in identifying community needs, developing project proposals, and partnering with Rotary districts and clubs around the world to secure Global Grant funding from The Rotary Foundation. 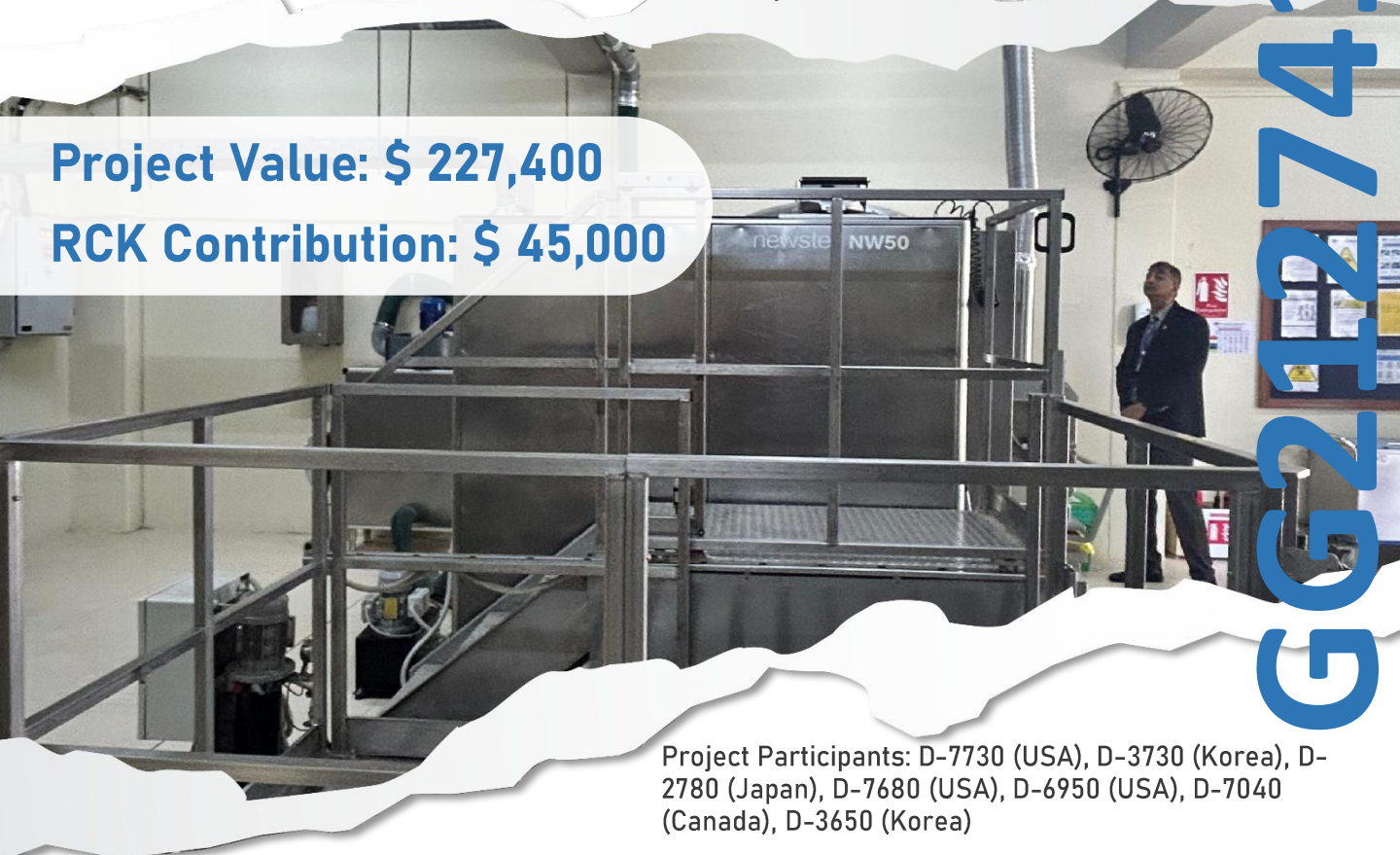


Hospital Waste Management

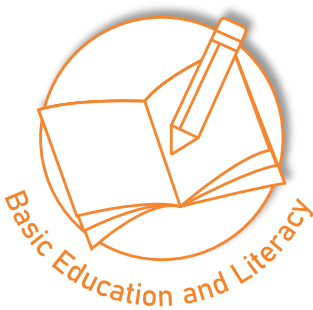

Fighting Coronavirus



RID3271 Rotary Fighting Coronavirus Project was launched as an emergency humanitarian response to the COVID-19 pandemic across Sindh and Balochistan. The project delivered over 100,000 essential medical items, including PPEs, N-95 and surgical masks, gloves, and digital thermometers, to 25 public and private hospitals. An online training program also equipped 1,000 community members, healthcare staff, and volunteers with COVID-19 prevention and safety protocols.

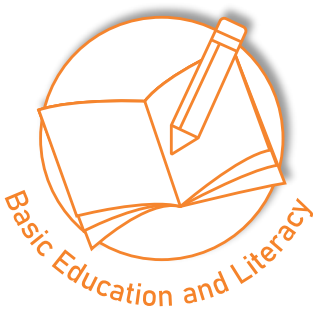

Literacy Project I



This project introduced computer education to underprivileged children in District Shaheed Benazirabad and Naushero Feroz. Three computer labs were established in remote Union Councils, providing 600 girls and boys with essential digital skills. The project also enrolled 200 out-of-school children and strengthened 20 government primary schools, while fully renovating 18 school buildings.

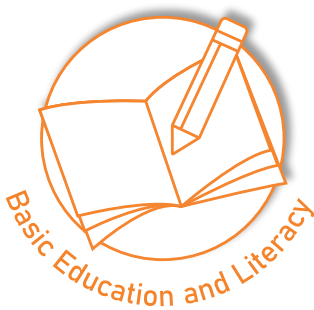

Building on its predecessor, this project installed 7 interactive smart boards and established 7 libraries in ECD/BDS schools, reaching nearly 2,000 children. Mobile library sessions extended literacy to 1,000 children in 50 remote government schools. Five computer labs were also established in government girls' schools, introducing 600 underprivileged girls to digital education for the first time.

ERWO Eye Center



This project equipped the Eliza Retinal Welfare Organization (ERWO) Eye Center with advanced diagnostic and surgical equipment, introducing vitreoretinal disease diagnosis and surgery to Nawabshah and Central Sindh for the first time. The center, which already served over 50 outpatients daily and performed 100+ annual eye operations, can now treat conditions that previously required travel to distant cities.

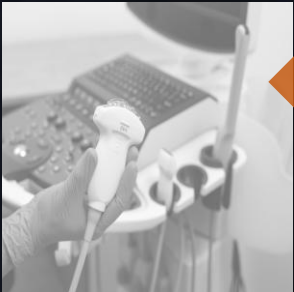

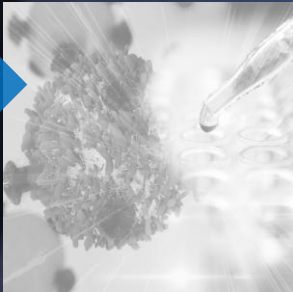
